

## LEARNING TO HEAR HIS VOICE: WORKSHOP

### Workshop Viewing Guide:

1. Click the PLAY arrow to begin the video. Use the first worksheet marked "Sample" to follow along with Anne as she walks you through the three questions.
2. After the first segment (at approximately 11:40), PAUSE the video by moving your mouse over the video screen so that the video controls appear in the bottom of the video screen and click the PAUSE symbol.
3. In this workshop, you will be studying Luke 9:10-17. Step 1 is to read the passage on your worksheet.
4. Use your worksheet to "List the Facts," answering the question: "What does the passage say?"
5. Press the PLAY arrow again and watch the second segment "Step 2: List the Facts."
6. PAUSE the video before Step 3 (at approximately 13:40). Using the facts you wrote on your worksheet, now "Learn the Lessons," answering the question: "What does it mean?"
7. Re-start the video and watch "Step 3: Learn the Lessons."
8. PAUSE the video again before Step 4 (at approximately 21:18). Refer to the lessons you wrote in Step 3 and now "Listen to His Voice," answering the question: "What does it mean to me?"
9. Re-start the video once more and watch "Step 4: Listen to His Voice" until the end.

<p><b>3:7</b> Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord: The word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him</p> <p><b>3:8</b> The Lord called Samuel a third time, and Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, “Here I am; you called me.” Then Eli realized that the Lord was calling the boy.</p> <p><b>3:9</b> So Eli told Samuel, “Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, ‘Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.’” So Samuel went and lay down in his place.</p> <p><b>3:10</b> The Lord came and stood there, calling as at the other times, “Samuel! Samuel!”</p>	<p><b>v.7</b> Samuel did not know the Lord; the Word had not been revealed.</p> <p><b>v.8</b> A 3<sup>rd</sup> time, the Lord called Samuel who went to Eli. Eli realized the Lord was calling.</p> <p><b>v.9</b> Eli told Samuel “lie down, if He calls, say, ‘Speak, your servant is listening.’”</p> <p><b>v.10</b> The Lord came calling, “Samuel.” Then Samuel said, “Speak, your servant is listening.”</p>	<p><b>v.7</b> There are people within the church who don’t know the Lord or His Word.</p> <p><b>v.8</b> Sometimes God has to speak to us repeatedly before we recognize His voice.</p> <p><b>v.9</b> We need instructions on how to listen to God speak.</p> <p><b>v.10</b> God speaks to us personally and we need to listen.</p>	<p><b>v. 7</b> How well do I know the Lord and His Word?</p> <p><b>v. 8</b> How many times does God have to speak to me before I recognize His voice?</p> <p><b>v.9</b> Am I willing to follow these instructions on how to listen?</p> <p><b>v.10</b> When I read my Bible, how expectant am I that God will speak to me?</p>

<p>10 When the apostles returned, they reported to Jesus what they had done. Then he took them with him and they withdrew by themselves to a town called Bethsaida,</p> <p>11 but the crowds learned about it and followed him. He welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.</p> <p>12 Late in the afternoon the Twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here."</p> <p>13 He replied, "You give them something to eat." They answered, "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all this crowd."</p> <p>14 (About five thousand men were there.) But he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each."</p> <p>15 The disciples did so, and everybody sat down.</p> <p>16 Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke them. Then he gave them to the disciples to set before the people.</p> <p>17 They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.</p>
